C New MI Website

A presentation was made on the proposed new MI website which will be more user friendly and will facilitate online competition license renewals based on/around our existing identity and logo.

A Expert Group

A working group has been formed to prepare for the return of motorsport at the appropriate time. Mr. Harper is chairing the group. Other members of the group are James Coleman, Pat O’Dowd, Fergal Henehan, Dr. Paul Rea, Rodney Greene, Arthur Walsh, Kieran Coleman and MI Safety/Training Officer, Ronnie Murphy. The objective of the group is to prepare the processes for presentation to government, which ensures that all disciplines of motorsport will make a safe return in line with government regulations and provide the basis for clubs and commissions to operate safely. The group has received feedback from the different commissions and this feedback is being taken into account when preparing the document.

C Digital Racing

A set of rules is being prepared for the introduction of an upcoming Digital Racing Championship

C Road Map for 2020 and 2021

A document will be circulated to the clubs on what will be required of them as the sport gradually reopens. Based on the current government roadmap, the 25th of July is the earliest that a clubs meeting can take place. MI plans to gather information from the clubs before that meeting which will enable a draft calendar to be circulated in advance of the meeting. After that meeting, clubs can then apply to run events in any gap that might arise. It was confirmed that the clubs will decide what events will run and it has been made clear to the clubs that there is no pressure to run an event if they are not happy to do so. The situation is fluid. The Council will support any club that is willing to run an event.

C Non-MI Events

A discussion has been held with the Minister for Sport on the subject of non-MI events and the safety impacts of these.

D Dates Application 2021

A new cut-off date for 2020/21 dates applications will be decided after the meeting with the clubs.
