3. New text must be entered in the "Proposed Rule" box in bold lettering and underlined i.e. **new text**.
4. New rules or rule changes become effective in accordance with GCR 180.


Existing Rule:

3.8.1. In addition to map references, Approved alternative methods of route instruction are Tulip Diagrams, reference to spot heights, gridlines, clock face approach/ depart directions, straight or curved herringbones and map traces. However, great care must be taken to ensure the clarity and accuracy of such alternative methods, particularly if issued other than with the main route card. Methods not listed herein shall not be used. Where Tulip or herringbone diagrams are used, distances between all node points must be given, either by intermediate figures or cumulative from the start. Where a route instruction incorporates unmapped roads, the end point of the route instruction must be given as a grid reference

Proposed Rule:

3.8.1. In addition to map references, Approved alternative methods of route instruction are Tulip ("**Ball and Arrow**") Diagrams, reference to spot heights, gridlines, clock face approach/depart directions, straight or curved herringbones and map traces. However, great care must be taken to ensure the clarity and accuracy of such alternative methods, particularly if issued other than with the main route card. Methods not listed herein shall not be used. Where Tulip or herringbone diagrams are used, **the start point must be indicated and distances between all node (i.e. junction) points must be given, either by intermediate figures or cumulative from the start. Where a route instruction incorporates unmapped roads, the end point of the route instruction must be given as a grid reference. The order in which points are to be visited need not necessarily be in the same sequence as shown on any route instructions, but where the instructions are set out other than to match the order to be visited, the required sequence must be clearly indicated.**
